It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

For use on non-crop areas such as fence rows, parking lots, around buildings, loading ramps, storage yards, tank farms, along pipelines, industrial plant sites and other similar areas where grasses and weeds interfere with drainage, create a fire hazard or cause unsightly appearance. This liquid weed killer is composed of 5-bromo-3-sec-butyl-6-methyluracii (Bromacii) and low volatile 2,4-D Ester. The low volume oil carrier provides rapid penetration and translocation in the plant. The insolubility of the herbicide in water assures full effect regardless of rainfall after application or stage of growth at time of application. This liquid weed killer may be applied at any time of the year except when the ground is frozen. Bet results are obtained after predominant weeds have emerged and developed to a point where they present a problem. Apply this product as k. No agitation or dilution is necessary and any equipment from sprinkler can to large sprayer may be fised. Equipment should be calibrated to assure application of the specified amount of weed failer.

Spray Drift Management A variety of factors including weather conditions (e.g., wind directions, wind speed, temperature, relative humidity) and method of application can influence pesticide drift. The applicator must evaluate all factors and make appropriate adjustments when applying this product.

Droplet Size When applying sprays that contain 2,4-D as the sole active ingredient, or when applying sprays that contain 2,4-D mixed with active ingredients that require a coarse or coarser spray, apply only as a coarse or coarser spray (ASAE standard 572) or a volume mean diameter of 385 microns or greater for spinning atomizer nozzles. When applying sprays that contain 2,4-D mixed with other active ingredients that require a medium or more fine spray, apply only as a

medium or coarser spray (ASAE standard 572) or a volume mean diameter of 300 microns or greater for spinning atomizer nozzles.

Wind speed Do not apply at wind speed greater than 15 mph. Only apply this product if the wind direction favors on-target deposition and there are not sensitive areas (including, but not limited to, residential areas, bodies of water, known habitat for nontarget species, nontarget crops) within 250 feet downwind. If applying a medium spray, leave one swath unsprayed at the downwind edge of the treated field

Temperature Inversions If applying at wing speeds less than 3 mph, the applicator must determine it: a) opnditions of temperature inversion exist, or b)stable atmospheric conditions exist at or below notice theight. Do not make applications into areas of temperature inversions or unstable atmospheric conditions.

Susceptible Plants Do not apply under circumstances where spray drift may occur to food forage, or other plantings that might be damaged or crops thereof rendered unfit for sale, use or tonsumption. Susceptible crops include, but are not immed to, botton other, flowers, grapes (in growing stage), fruit trees (foliage), soybeans (vegetative stage), ornamentals, sunflowers, tomatoes, beans, and other vegetables, or tobacco. Small amounts of spray drift that might not be visible may injure susceptible broadleaf plants.

Other State and Local Requirements Applicators must follow all state and local pesticide drift requirements regarding application of 2,4-D herbicides. Where states have more stringent regulations they must be observed.

Equipment All ground application equipment must be properly maintained and calibrated using appropriate carriers or surrogates.

For ground boom application: Do not apply with a nozzle height greater than 4 feet above the crop canopy. 2,4-D esters may volatilize during conditions of low humidity and high temperatures. Do not apply during conditions of low humidity and high temperatures.

Application Restrictions: Do not apply this product in a way that will contact workers or other persons, either directly or through drift. Only protected handlers may be in the area during application. Not to be used in any recreational areas or in or around homes.

Postemergence (annual & perennial weeds): Limited to two applications per year. Maximum of 40 gallons per acre per application. Minimum of 30 days between applications. Application to non-cropland areas are not applicable, to treatment of commercial timber or other plants being grown for sale or other commercial use, or for commercial seed production, or for research purposes.

Entry Restrictions: Do not enter or allow people (or pets) to enter the treated areas until sprays have dried. Prohibited for aerial applications.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do Not Contaminate Water, Food, or Feed By Storage or Disposal.

Pesticide Storage: Store in a dry place no lower in temperature than 50°F or higher than 120°F.

Pesticide Disposal: Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal Law. Container Disposal: Nonrefillable container. Do not reuse or refill container. Offer for recycling, if available. Clean container promptly after emptying. Triple rinse as follows: Empty the remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank and drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Fill the container 1/4 full with water and recap. Shake for 10 seconds. Pour rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Repeat procedure two more times.

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
